FROM THE CHAIR

Each of you should have been contacted by one or another member of the EC just before Easter. If you were not, then please contact the Secretary/Membership secretary because it means our records were not up to date – stand fast those of you who live outside south east England. The Ring Round served two purposes: one to establish some form of contact now that the Events programme has been suspended and two, to assist in any way should assistance have been needed. It seems that all of you appreciated the call and, happily, only a very few needed any assistance. As a by-product of the Ring Round we discovered that a few of you have health/welfare issues and, where asked, we have taken action as necessary. For the future we are considering contacting those members who do not regularly attend SANO events – possibly on an annual basis. As a reminder, the data/information the EC holds on the SANO membership are for the purpose of administering the Association and are not shared with any outside organisation.

Until such time as things return to normal, whatever that 'normal' looks like, the SANO events programme remains suspended. You have long since received the papers/reports for the AGM whose date has been and gone but, to satisfy the constitution, we will be holding a shortened AGM probably combined with a lecture/lunch later in the year when things have returned to 'normal'. With the date of the MGN (15 May) falling into the 13-week period (never mind a possible third three-week extension) it has been cancelled however, the EC may consider re-instating it (by way of celebration?) – again, if things return to 'normal' sooner rather than later. Above all we hope that 'all this' will be over in good time for us to be able to celebrate our traditional Trafalgar Night dinner.




PROGRAMME OF EVENTS 2020
